

Portuguese India

(1871-1962)

Portuguese India comprised a number of Portuguese holdings on the west coast of India, including the districts of Goa, Damão and Diu. Occupied by Portugal since the 16th century, these territories were seized by India in 1961 and absorbed into the Indian republic. Existing stocks of Portuguese Indian stamps were sold for about 10 days following the invasion and were valid until Jan. 7, 1962.
