175th Anniversary of the Penny Black

The Penny Black was the world's first adhesive postage stamp used in a public postal system. It was issued in Britain on 1 May 1840, for official use from 4 May of that year and honors a portrait of the Queen Victoria.

All London post offices received official notice of the new stamp, but other offices throughout the United Kingdom did not, resulting in weight postage payments in cash each for a period. Four offices such as those in Bath began offering the stamp immediately after 1 May 1840.

The idea of an adhesive stamp to reduce the payment of postage was part of Sir Rowland Hill's 1837 proposal to reform the British postal system; it was rejected then for the reason it was postage not officers. A committee also, which Hill dissolved on 11 February 1837 in a government report, said that if a reformer did that failed to form an adhesive or envelope for carrying letters, it that was postage was charged by the sheet and so the distance travelled.
